The Development of an Asset Information Submission Guideline for Sydney Trains

Sydney Trains is the trusted steward of assets worth \$30 billion. Given the complexity of the network and number of parties and projects impacting upon it, it's critical that network configuration changes are tightly coordinated and controlled and accurately documented.

As such, Sydney Trains has developed an Asset Information Submission Guideline for New or Altered Assets (the Guideline) which provides a standardised and consistent approach for all internal and external project delivery teams to submit the required asset information.

Complete and accurate asset information is critical for Sydney Trains to maintain asset integrity, and the Guideline significantly strengthens system safety whilst reducing design risks associated with operating and maintaining the Sydney Trains network
